## What is TAEN?

Established during 2015 to promote agricultural education in Tasmanian schools, the Tasmanian Agricultural Education Network (TAEN) has transitioned into an association affiliated with the National Association of Agricultural Educators (NAAE). Membership of the TAEN is not only for educators, but also individuals and groups interested in promoting high-quality agricultural education.

## What is the NAAE?

The National Association of Agricultural Educators (NAAE) is a national member-based organisation, which provides leadership at a national level in promoting and developing agricultural education in Australia.

## What does TAEN membership cost?

TAEN individual membership costs \$25 per year (\$10 of your TAEN membership goes to the NAAE) and TAEN corporate membership costs \$110 per year.

## TAEN individual membership benefits

- TAEN individual members receive regular networking opportunities with educators and industry.
- TAEN individual members receive regular updates on agricultural education initiatives across Tasmania.
- TAEN individual members can attend TAEN-hosted events for free or at a significant discount to non-members.
